Our approach to the study of society examines the possibilities for improvement in these schemes and systems. The range is extensive and the targets vary. In this department, all of you can seek out and discover social phenomena for yourselves, while studying diverse fields and techniques

such as Media Studies, Theory of the Family, Economics, Studies on Contemporary Society, Cultural Anthropological Study, and Comparative Sociology.

## Learn Practical Abilities and Basic Skills"

As a pioneer of social welfare education in Asia, the department develops personnel who create multicultural societies. You can learn practical abilities in diversified fields related to social welfare and basic skills that you can apply in society at large. It provides a wide-ranging curriculum through which you will study the history of the ideas and practices of social welfare, and how they developed up to the present time, focusing on the future. Learning about the social security system will help you gain an understanding of the concept of equal rights for all human beings. You will also practice interpersonal support

and work with communities in small-group practical curriculums including a social practical work experience seminar. You can also gain qualifications for licensing exams for social worker, psychiatric social worker, and other positions by completing the prescribed courses.



## Department of Education

Fully Supporting Your Dream of Entering the Teaching Profession! You will study a wide variety of fields in theory and practice of education such as sociology, psychology, history, philosophy, curriculum research, and educational methods. This department also provides opportunities for studying, lifelong learning, community activities, and multicultural education. In addition, it includes full curriculums for the teaching profession, such as Japanese language, mathematics, social studies, and music. These studies help unlock students' capabilities to open up the future by deepening their understanding of human beings and society through the window we call "education."

## Department of Psychology

Gaining a Deeper Understanding of the Mind through Practical Small-group Learning This department utilizes many small-group lessons to help students learn psychology through a more practical approach. You will learn experimental and survey methods to study psychology and human behavior, and gain skills in psychological assessment and counseling. These skills are essential not only in education, mental health, and social welfare, but are also invaluable in fields such as sales and marketing, advertising, planning, service, and law.

### Department of Humanities and Cultures

Experiencing Our Global Society through the Study of Foreign Languages You will gain a general understanding of European, American, and Asian cultures, focusing on foreign language studies. The department also provides curriculums related to Japanese culture, which is on the basis of our understanding of foreign culture, and Japanology taught in English. It also offers a wide-ranging curriculum in fine art. One workshop focuses on dance, while another course gives students a solid background in doing fieldwork. Short-term intercultural programs on Europe, Asia, and Southeast Asia are presented by Department of Culture professors, and are especially popular with students year after year.
