Japan Women's University began in 1901 as the first women's higher educational institution in Japan.

THE OBJECTIVES AND FEATURES OF THE PROGRAM

• Students nominated by partner universities will be accepted after selection and approval.

[1] For students with intermediate (A2) or upper-intermediate (B1) Japanese proficiency]

- Exchange students at this level will take <u>3 Japanese language courses</u> based on their proficiency: Oral expression (2 classes per week), Writing (2 classes per week), and Vocabulary (1 class per week).
- In addition, they are required to register for <u>at least 3 more courses</u>—taught in either Japanese or English—together with JWU students, depending on their language skills and academic needs.
- They may also enroll in about 2-3 weeks Intensive Japanese Language Course held in February.
- Students are encouraged to aim for JLPT N3 or N2 by the end of their exchange period.
- *Exchange students with Japanese proficiency of JLPT N2 or higher may register for regular Japanese language classes taken by degree-seeking students.

(2) For students taking courses in their major taught in English)

- Students in this category are required to register for <u>6 or more classes per week.</u>
- If desired, they may also take beginner Japanese course (A1) (4 classes per week) or absolute beginner Japanese course (Pre-A1, no prior study) (2 classes per week).
- * As only a limited number of faculties offer courses in English, prior consultation with the International Office is required.

CURRICULUM FOR EXCHANGE STUDENTS

1 For students with intermediate or upper-intermediate Japanese proficiency

1. Japanese Language Study

- The intermediate course (A2) is suitable for students who have already completed 2
 years of Japanese language study at the time of program participation and are aiming
 for N3.
- 2. The upper intermediate course (B1) covers up to the N2 level of the JLPT.
- 3. Exchange students wishing to study in advanced N2 to N1 level classes can take courses for degree-seeking international students.

CREDITS FOR JAPANESE LANGUAGE COURSE

1 For students with intermediate or upper-intermediate Japanese proficiency

Fall/ Spring Semester

- The Japanese language courses have 5 morning classes per week.
- After completion, exchange students receive 10 credits for each fall and spring semester.
- The Total class time for each semester is 6,750 minutes (112.5 hours).

Winter Intensive Japanese Course

- The Winter Intensive Course is a 2–3
 week program held in February,
 focusing mainly on Japanese cultural
 experiences.
- After completion, exchange students receive 6 credits for winter intensive course.
- The Total class time for each semester is 4,050 minutes (57 hours).

2 For students joining exchange program taught in English (Faculty of Architecture and Design)

1. Faculty of Architecture and Design (Fall Semester Only)

- Architectural Design III
- Housing and Architecture Studies
- Sustainable Society and Architecture Design

In addition, there is a list of unpaid internships at architectural design firms.

Students interested in internships may apply.

Beginner or absolute beginner level Japanese course is also available.

University Dormitory

Only for female students

On Campus(5 minutes by walk)





- ☐ Single Room
- Shared kitchen, toilet and bathroom
- Meals Provided: Breakfast and dinner Mon.~Fri. Breakfast on Sat. No meals on Sun, National Holidays, and Feb. to Mar.
- Need to leave the dormitory from the end of the year to the beginning of the year for 2 weeks and at the end of March for a week.
- Free Wi-Fi
- No Alcohol, No Smoking
- Only 8 rooms is available for each year.

Dormitory & Meal fees: approximately US \$ 586 (88,000yen) per month

Share House

Off Campus(3 minutes by walk)





- Single Room
- Shared kitchen, toilet and bathroom
- 40,000 yen move-in fee supported by JWU
- ☐ Free Wi-Fi
- No Smoking
- Interact with international students from various countries

Share House fee: approximately US \$ 566 (85,000yen) per month

Homestay

Arranged by Homestay in Japan

Off Campus (up to 1 hour by train)



- Single Room
- Shared kitchen, toilet and bathroom
- Meals Provided: Breakfast and dinner Mon.~Sun.
- Free Wi-Fi
- Arrangement fee is required

Homestay fee: approximately US \$ 29.3(4,400yen)+ tax per day + commuter pass

Reference: US\$1=150yen

ACCOMMODATION

University Dormitory

Only for female students

Advantages

- ✓ Very near from JWU
- Exchange students can communicate daily with Japanese students.

Disadvantages

- ✓ The available room is low.
- ✓ The rules are strict
 - 24:00 o'clock curfew
 - Need to submit a Overnight leave request <u>in advance</u> to be allowed to stay out.), etc.

Share House

Advantages

- ✓ Very near from JWU
- Exchange students can communicate daily with international students from other university
- ✓ More flexible than JWU dorm

Disadvantages

✓ The room is small.

Homestay

Arranged by Homestay in Japan


Advantages

- ✓ Daily native Japanese conversation


Disadvantages
